GP diary series – getting ready for a busy winter

As Farzana's practice prepares itself for a busy winter, it is working on its flu campaign to make sure those adults and patients at risk of flu and its complications have the flu vaccination. Working through a Plan, Do, Study, Act (PDSA) cycle, it aims to help achieve its target of delivering 480 vaccinations by the end of December. With 180 flu vaccinations already given within the first four weeks of the campaign, the practice is already more than a third of the way to meeting its target. [Watch the diary](#)

Releasing time for more effective consultations

A practice in Blackpool used Productive General Practice Quick Start to improve the way it managed patients that frequently attended and ensure they were receiving appropriate care. From 1,016 attendances the practice has already released 246 (24 per cent) appointments over the course of the year. This will release 41 hours of clinical time to focus on more appropriate consultations. [Read the story](#)
