- No 'them and us' – we will all rely on one combined STP programme budget for treatment

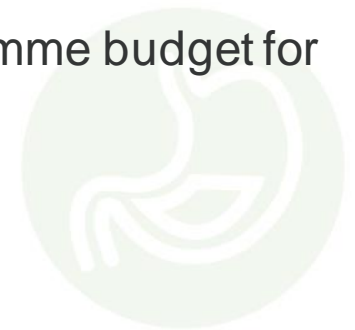

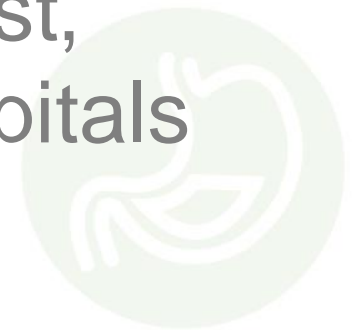
