The aim of the day will be to discuss points raised at the previous meeting including how we can break down the audit into manageable tasks, who can get involved, how long does the process take, the different stages of audit and how you can move forward from where you are now.

For those of you were absent at the previous meeting, the Bliss Baby Charter Audit Tool is a toolkit developed by Bliss to help hospital neonatal units assess the quality of Family-Centred Care they provide to babies and their families. The objective of the audit tool project is to ensure that units across the UK are consistently delivering high quality neonatal and family-centred care as per the Department of Health's Toolkit (2009). The audit tool complements the Bliss Baby Charter which sets out guiding standards and principles in non-clinical neonatal care.
