- ▶ Structures put in place re covid-19 remain for now following pausing of the Maternity Transformation Programme – continued regular operational discussions with NHSE, ODN, CN, MVPs.
- ▶ Service continues to be maintained on all sites except Bassetlaw: re-opening pushed back to 1<sup>st</sup> November 2020, DBTH have plan to address staffing shortfalls. General picture of staff returning from shielding, etc. – as per People Plan, we will continue to work innovatively and to support vulnerable staff.
- ▶ LMS Board reinstated and held 28 July 2020, all sub-committees reinstated.
- ▶ LMS engagement with MVPs and commissioners increasing as reset continues; regular engagement sessions and targeted work.
- ▶ “LMS Plan Refresh and Recovery” workshop held 23 June with excellent multi-agency engagement to discuss priorities for 20-21 and allocation of transformation funding. However, clarity required on national transformation funding picture to enable any new spend/plans to be confirmed.



# Neonatal Improvement Work

- ▶ MgSO4 administration has increased across SYB to 87% which is up 11% from 2018 data.

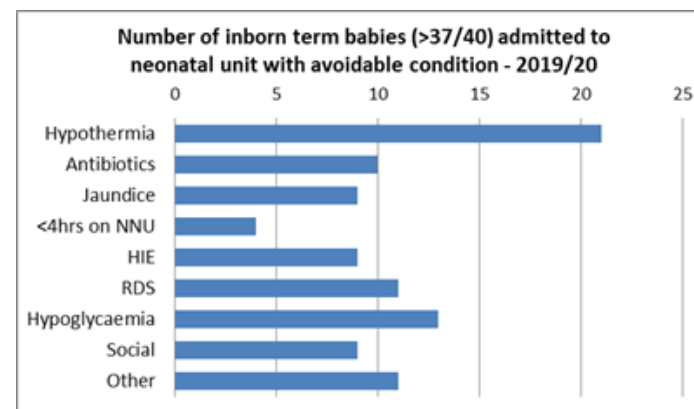


- ▶ <27w (NNU)/<34w (SCBU) – there were 10 off pathway <27w births

- ▶ Off pathway exception reporting was paused in the immediate months of the pandemic – an extraordinary exception reporting and learning meeting has been arranged for 9 September to review outstanding cases.
- ▶ Work has begun on producing a report “Improving Neonatal Outcomes - Learning and Themes from 2019/20 Case Reviews”. This will be shared with the Exec Group once completed.
- ▶ ATAIN task and finish group has been re-established post covid and met on 5<sup>th</sup> August. Discussed developing a peer review process for complex off pathway cases. All on track to meet CNST element for ATAIN.
- ▶ Continue to work closely with the ODN and other local LMSs on developing a plan for implementation of the NNCCR recommendations.
- ▶ SBL - Preterm: Post COVID assessment shows good progress towards achieving full compliance despite challenges during the pandemic. Most elements had improved from survey 1 submission. Working LMS groups are being re-established. Funding planned for training to support compliance with uterine artery doppler screening (subject to overall funding caveat).
